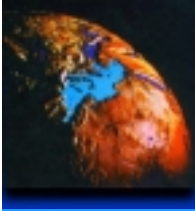

A framework Strategy

3 parts:

- 3 challenges and 4 main objectives,
- 7 essential issues,
- Implementation: mobilising actors, implementing the strategy and monitoring progress



Part I : 3 Challenges / 4 Objectives



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1. The environmental challenge
2. The demographic, economic and social challenge
3. The challenge of globalisation, regional co-operation and governance

I - Increasing economic development by enhancing Mediterranean assets

II - Reduce social deficits by implementing the Millennium Goals

III - End the irreversible degradation of global and regional public goods, insure sustainable management of natural resources and reduce the increasing vulnerability to natural risks

IV - Improve governance efficiency and participation at local and regional level



Part 2 : 7 essential Issues

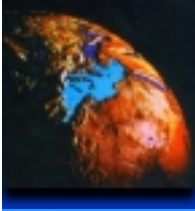


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- 1 Promoting sustainable urban development**

1. Mediterranean cooperation

Regional follow-up of the Strategy



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1/ Regional balance sheet every two years (in depth balance sheet every five years).

- Need for a **limited set of priority indicators (~ 40)** for producing every two years short documents showing the progress

2/ Strengthen the exchange of experiences on the 7 priority fields

- Regional workshops will be organised and will propose a limited set of indicators for each issue (eg: 5 to 15 indicators).



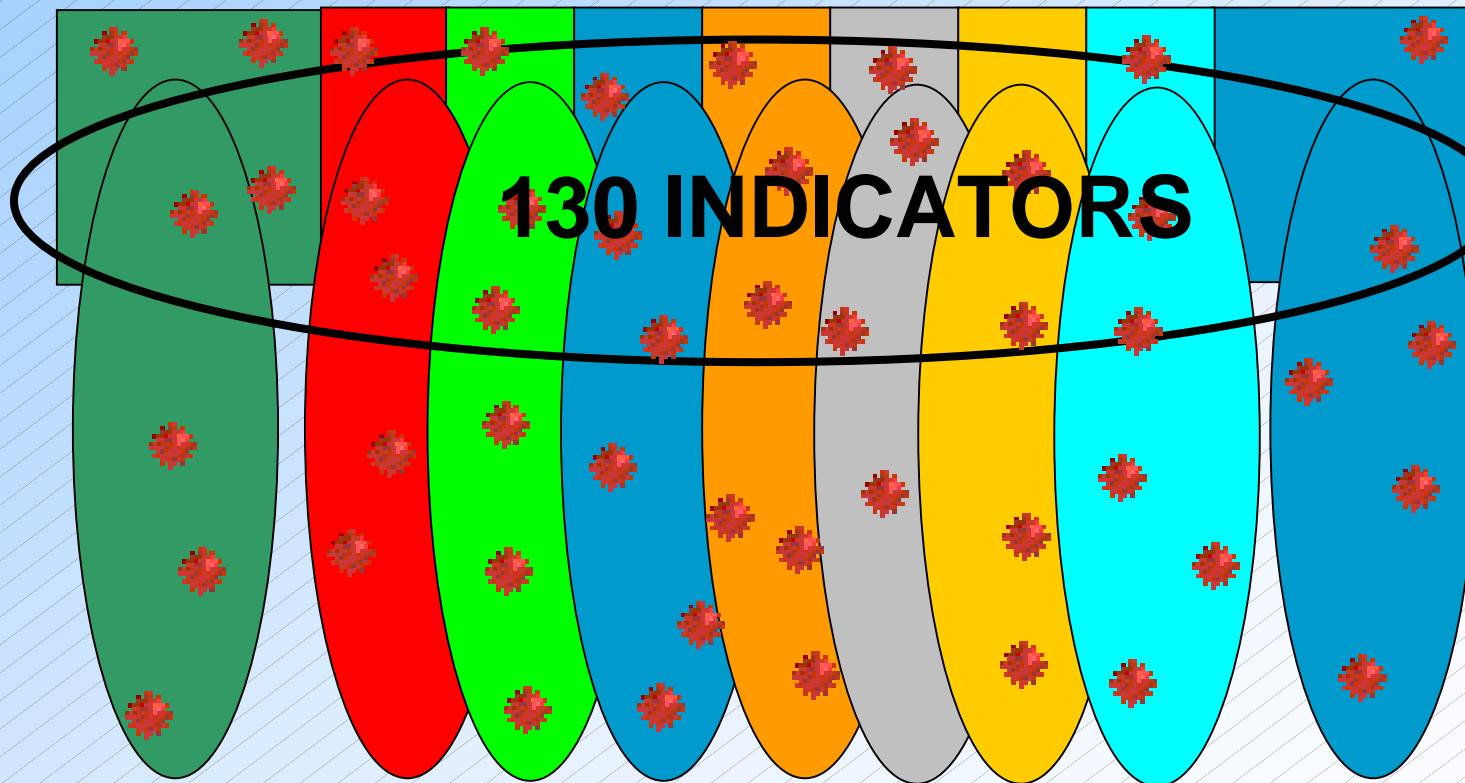
